





The Japan America Society of Chicago would like to acknowledge and deeply thank the Al & Mary Koga trust fund for their generous contribution. The Koga's legacy is a tribute to the continued friendship between the U.S. and Japan.

Mary's interests and intellectual curiosity were legion. Her greatest love, and requited at that, was her service with the Japan America Society of Chicago. Her unlawful imprisonment in a detention camp for the Japanese Americans during World War II resulted in a leadership role in resuscitating in the post-World War II era the Society, a membership association which fosters mutual friendship and understanding between the peoples of Japan and the United States. The Society was established in 1930 to foster the good-will mission, but disbanded early in 1942 with the outbreak of the war between Japan and the U.S. in 1941. However, the Society retained its legal entity, and the likes of Mary and Al Koga, her devoted husband, in concert with others, revived the Society in 1958. This achievement was crowned by a 1962 visit to Chicago by Crown Prince Akihito and the Crown Princess, affectionately referred to at the time, as Michiko-san.

The ensuing 45-year history of the Japan America Society of Chicago after its restoration in 1958 can be characterized as the Mary Koga era. She held a seat on the Board of the Society and participated in the formulation of policy to ensure membership growth. Above all, she provided leadership for a nascent Women's Board, whose mission was to bring together the spouses of Japanese and American executives in a mutually productive and fruitful relationship.

Wherever you may be, Mary and Al Koga, your progeny in the Society hail you. We will never forget your dedication and kindness.
